Foreword

Each of *Fabricate's* 72 schemata shows voice-leading paths for seven voices through twelve diatonic collections.

These schemata may be used to undergird group improvisations, supplying background counterpoint beneath whatever surface activity emerges from the ensemble. In this mode, gestural and textural elaborations may illuminate or obscure the schemata; the extent to which the schemata are apprehensible to the listener is at the ensemble's discretion. All, some, or none of the voices may be audible at any particular time.


Alternately, the schemata may be played as written on sustaining instruments moving at regular intervals of time according to the signals of a leader or conductor. In this mode, the principal variables for the ensemble to consider are timbre, speed, loudness, and placement in the performance space.

In either mode, the indicated pitches may be played in any octave.

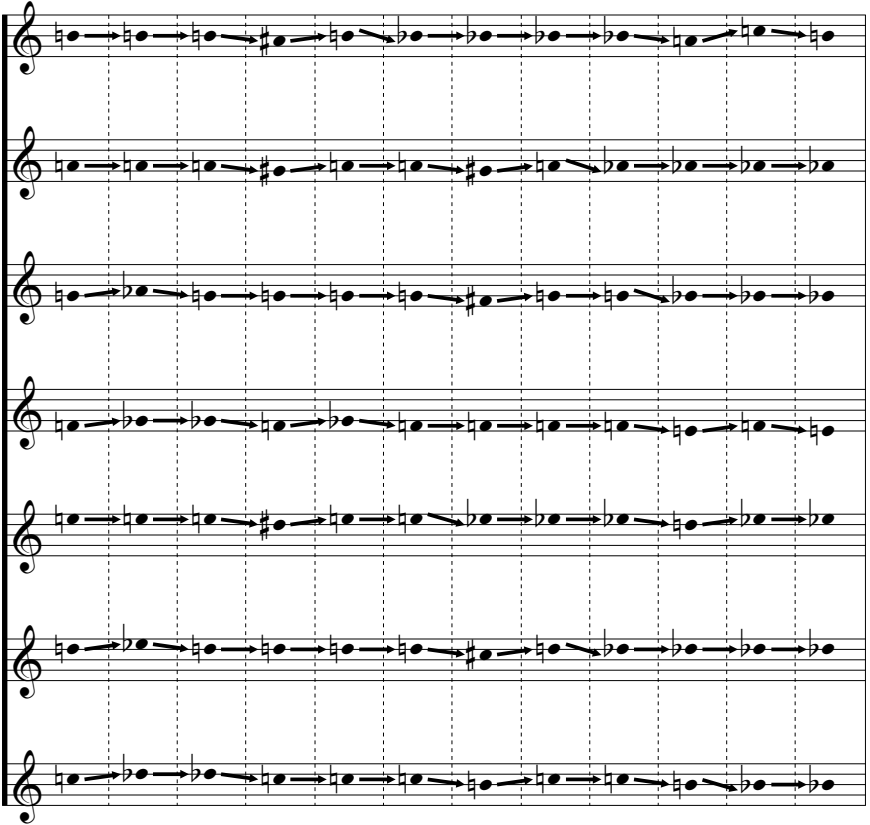

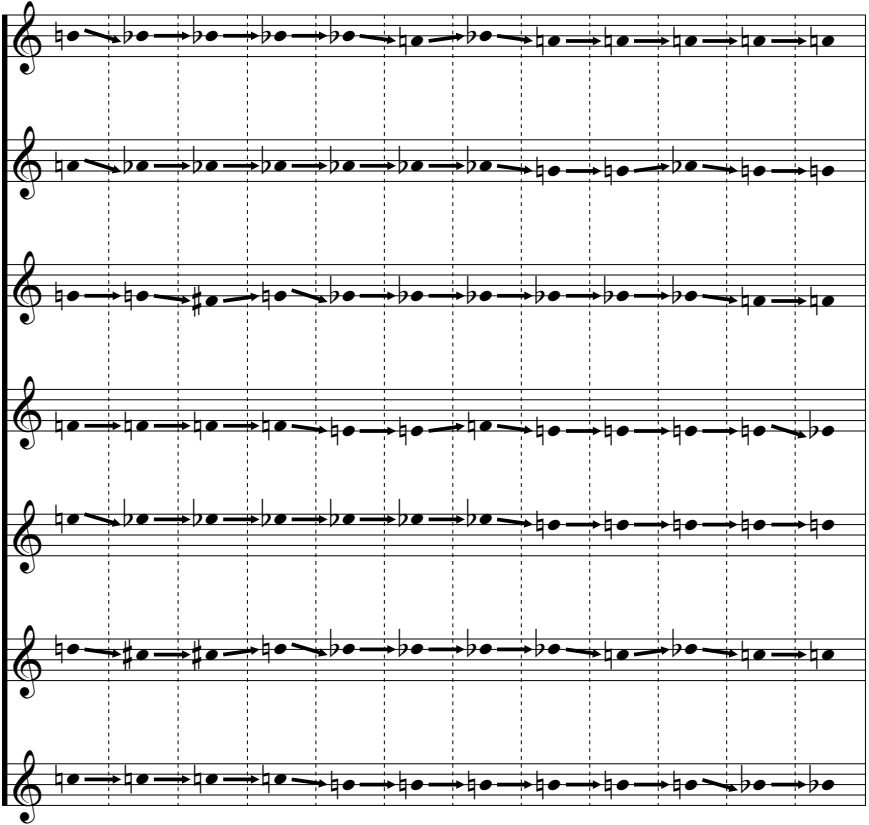
